<u>DEFERRED DISPOSITION INSTRUCTIONS</u> FOR TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS

READ INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY - Failure to do so will void your request.

Pursuant to Code of Criminal Procedure Article 45.051 Suspension of Sentence and Deferral of Final Disposition

- The defendant must enter a plea of no contest or guilty and make a request to the Court for Deferred Disposition.
- The request must be made in writing by the Court issued appearance date.
- If you are 24 years of age or younger and request Deferred Disposition, you will be required to complete a state approved Driver's Safety Course.
- You are not eligible for Deferred Disposition if you hold a CDL (Commercial Driver's License)
- You are not eligible if you were speeding 25 or more miles over the speed limit.
- You are not eligible if you have a moving violation in a construction zone with workers present.
- If you are uncertain of eligibility for Deferred, contact the Court in which the ticket is filed.
- An administrative fee will be assessed if Deferred Disposition is granted.
